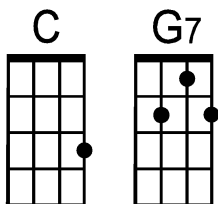


"Buffalo" Gals

The song's name "Buffalo" comes from the city of Buffalo, NY but any location's name can be substituted in the title.

Chorus: C Buffalo gals, won't you come out to-night, G7 come out to-night, C come out to-night
C Buffalo gals, won't you come out to-night and G7 dance by the C light of the moon—

C As I was walking down the street, G7 down the street, C down the street

C A pretty little gal I chanced to meet, oh, G7 she was fair to see— C

C I stopped her and we had a talk, G7 had a talk, C had a talk

C Her feet took up the whole side-walk and G7 left no room for me— C
